The travel programs ECC is doing for the Littleton Community Center have been scheduled as follows:

Sept. 9 - *Russian River Cruise* - Join **Rod Hull** as he takes a river cruise in Russia. This trip is different from the usual tour of Russia, and the photographs will help you enjoy Russia as Rod did.

Oct 14 - *Beyond Impressionism*: Artists and Scenery From the South of France - **Fred Luhman** presents this program. Successors to the early Impressionist Movement, such as Van Gogh, Cezanne, Matisse, and Picasso were inspired by the dazzling light and countryside of Provence and the French Riviera.

Nov. 11 - *Egypt* - Take an armchair trip to Egypt with **Dan Griest**. You will sail on the Nile to visit Abu Simbel, The Valley of the Kings, and Luxor. See the pyramids and the Sphinx at Giza, and the oldest of the Egyptian pyramids at Sakkara, near Cairo, as well as mosques, minarets and the bustling city of Cairo.

Dec. 9 - *Ecuador* - Visit Ecuador with **Don Rothschild** as he shows you the contrasts in the cities, the countryside, and the coast. You'll experience the streets of the cities and see how the natives live in this third world country--a place not many people go for vacation.

The programs will be on Thursdays at 1:00 after lunch at the Center. ECC members are welcome to come if they want. However, please let the Center know if you want to come so that they know how large a room to use for the program. They usually ask for about 75 cents to help defray costs. The phone number of the Center is 303-794-9216.

If you would like to go to the lunch before the program, the cost is \$5.00 for members and \$6.15 for non-members. (It costs \$3.00 to join South Suburban Recreation Center for 2 years. Then you can use any recreation center.) You should register for lunch by the day before. If you register for lunch and need to

cancel, you should do it by the day before the lunch. The menu for the lunches for each month is available in the brochure rack near the front desk. (If you need to request a special diet, talk to the Center.)

TWO PONDS NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

On a beautiful Saturday on June 5, 2004, National Trails Day was celebrated nationwide and National Wildlife Rangers hosted a smorgasbord of programs, educational displays, and hikes at this, the smallest National Wildlife Refuge in the nation. Two ponds is really a community of habitats linked together with care-taking efforts of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and which provide the essential components of food, shelter, and water for numerous plants and animals. One may be surprised at the variety of wildlife you may literally stumble across in this natural oasis in the heart of Arvada. In 1990 the site was saved from development and the area was established officially as a National Wildlife Refuge in 1992. The 72 acre refuge contains 3 ponds, 9 acres of wetlands, an apple orchard; it is visited by 112 species of birds, 11 mammals, and 6 reptiles. Wildlife most frequently seen are mule deer, butterflies, painted turtles, kestrels, dragonflies, kingfishers, jays, red-winged blackbirds, great blue herons, black-crowned night herons, ducks, geese, magpies, foxes, and raccoons. A self-guided tour has been established with 14 stops at numbered posts, and a guide brochure at the entrance.

You might just surprise a deer on the same path, flush birds off the trail, observe a variety of fish slurping insects off the surface right at the pond's edge, and enjoy the majesty of a watchful black-crowned night heron stalking fish – and all this in 20 minutes, as this author did. Be advised to wear long pants to protect from the prickly pear cactus and thistle plants. Refuge staff are continually removing

imported shrubs and grasses from 130 years of pioneer activity, and re-establishing native plant communities. At present it is so wild that paths for humans are still densely covered with low grasses. The Refuge has limited hours open to the public: Tuesday and Thursday 8-4, and Saturday 8-4 (ignore the hours on the sign of 11-4). Free tours are available for groups of 10 or more. Call the Refuge staff at 303-289-0232 to make a group reservation or for more information. The Refuge is located at 80th and Kipling. The main entrance is on 80th, east of Kipling St. There are minor entrances on Kipling and W. 77th Drive (the south side of the property), but the ponds are not accessible, as the Farmer's Highline Canal divides the property and bridges do not exist (yet).
